
Published Student Work

Riverwinds Community Center

As most of you know, one of the many great resources in West Deptford is the River Winds Community Center (RWCC). This full service athletic facility is used by our district in many ways all year. The staff and community at the RWCC has been extremely accommodating to our many athletic programs that use the facility. We are very fortunate to work in a community that has made a facility like this a priority and opens it for our athletic team use. As the Holidays are approaching, a WDBOE staff membership is a great way to

support the community and access a world-class fitness center at a great price. Please see the following information below and the attachments from the RWCC.

As employees of the district, we have memberships available to WD BOE employees at the resident rate whether the employee resides in WD or not. All memberships are for one year, and patrons have the option to pay in full or choose the monthly payment plan via electronic funds transfer (EFT). If the monthly option is used, members must agree to pay for one year, and then the membership continues on a month-to-month basis after the 12 months have been completed. The only difference in pricing is a one-time \$10 setup fee for the monthly payments via credit card or checking account.

Membership includes the use of the fitness center and indoor track (ages 14 and older), swimming pools, rock climbing wall, and basketball courts. Any activity with an instructor has an additional cost.
